Scott Anderson is a director and senior economist at Wells Fargo based in Minneapolis. He is responsible for the analysis and forecasting of international, national and regional economic trends. He was recently named one of the Top 10 economic forecasters in the country by. Before joining Wells Fargo as senior economist in 2001, he held positions at Moody's Analytics in USA Today Philadelphia and the International Monetary Fund in Washington, D.C.

Anderson provides daily analyses of U.S. economic releases and contributes to the Wells Fargo Economics' macroeconomic forecast. He authors the Wells Fargo California and Minnesota Outlook reports, and contributes to the Weekly Economic & Financial Commentary report and Monthly Economic Outlook report. He also covers the economies of Japan, Singapore, South Korea and Taiwan.
